Prop 64 PH&S Grant Program

- November of 2016, voters approved Proposition 64, the Control, Regulate and Tax Adult Use of Marijuana Act (AUMA).
- AUMA legalized the recreational use of marijuana in California for individuals 21 years of age and older.
- Proposition 64 provides a portion of the tax revenue from the cultivation and retail sale of cannabis or cannabis products toward funding local assistance grants, including grants under the BSCC for:
 - law enforcement, fire protection, or other local programs addressing public health and safety associated with the implementation of the AUMA.



Prop 64 PH&S Grant Program

Revenue and Taxation Code (RTC)

Eligible Applicants:

Local government entities that have not banned the commercial cultivation or retail sale of marijuana or marijuana products





PROPOSITION 64 PH&S GRANT

Banned the Cultivation

Regulations, ordinances, or amendments to local government charters that prohibit BOTH:

- Indoor commercial cannabis cultivation and
- Outdoor commercial cannabis cultivation

within the local government's jurisdiction/authority that is not otherwise preempted by state law.
