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# JAIL PROFILE SURVEY

## EXPLANATION OF RESULTS

The following pages contain the Jail Profile Survey results for the third quarter of 2003. Page 1 contains the quarterly totals based upon the monthly and quarterly data submitted to us by the participating jurisdictions. Pages 2 and 3 show the trend data for variables we have been tracking for the last ten years. The remainder of this page provides explanations and clarifications of the data presented.

### Page 1

- Unless otherwise noted, "projected totals" are based upon the average per day for the variable in question. For example, there was an average of 75,285 inmates per day in local jails (excluding Type I's) during the three-month span of July to September 2003.
- For some variables (other than ADP), we did not receive data from all jurisdictions. We compute the percentage of the ADP that was housed in the jurisdictions that did supply their data for the variable in question. Next, we increase the received number for the variable in question by an amount that estimates the statewide total. For example, if 90% of the state's ADP was housed in jurisdictions that provided us with the number of Three Strike inmates, we would increase that number by 1/9<sup>th</sup> to estimate the state total.
- The number for "Bookings" is the average of the monthly totals for July, August, and September.
- For the following variables, the numbers presented are the totals as of the mid-quarter (i.e., August 15, 2003); Pretrial Release, Early Release, 2 and 3 Strikes, Felony Warrants, Misdemeanor Warrants, Juveniles in Custody and Undocumented Aliens.
- "Assaults" is the total number of serious inmate assaults on staff (resulting in a crime report), statewide, during the third quarter of 2003.

### Pages 2 and 3

- The data in the 10-Year Summary tables are based upon survey data which the Board has gathered since the early 1980's.
- Prior to 1995, yearly averages were reported to the Board on an annual basis. Yearly averages from 1996 on have been the average across the 12 calendar months. In 1995, the yearly figure reported is the fourth quarter average, since we do not have data from the first three quarters.

- a. The Average Daily Population for all Jurisdictions (excluding Type I's) does not include inmates in holding areas.
- b. Unless otherwise indicated, the numbers reported are the average daily number of inmates in the quarter.
- c. "Under the Roof" is the sum of the Average Daily Population plus the average daily number of inmates in Holding Areas.
- d. Totals may not be the exact sum of the subtotals due to rounding.
- e. The sum of all Highest One Day inmate population counts from all jurisdictions.
- f. These data are collected on a monthly basis; this figure is an average of the total numbers collected each month during this quarter.
- g. These data are one-day snapshots collected at the end of the quarter.







It has seemed that with the recent budget crisis, the State has been "on hold" in many respects. It has certainly been true with regard to jail populations. The ADP (75,285 in the 3rd Quarter), has, uncharacteristically, changed by fewer than 300 inmates in the last four Quarters. Budgetary considerations have certainly affected the ADP. Jurisdictions have recently lowered "time served percentages," increased bail amounts below which individuals are automatically released, and even closed facilities due to budget restrictions. Until the budget picture improves, about 75,000 inmates will continue to be an arbitrary ADP ceiling for jails in California.



In contrast to the very stable ADP, the number of non-sentenced inmates has increased by almost 500 inmates since the previous Quarter, and by over 2,000 inmates when compared to the same Quarter in 2002. Since the year 2000, the non-sentenced ADP has increased by more than 5,000 inmates (compared with an increase in overall ADP of only about 400 inmates).



The sentenced ADP is at its lowest point in more than a decade. The sentenced ADP for 1993 was 31,677 inmates. The sentenced ADP for the 3rd Quarter 2003 was 25,770 inmates. The number of sentenced inmates in the past 12 months dropped by about 2,400. Currently over 8,500 inmates a month are being released early from their sentences due solely to lack of jail space. Therefore, this decline in the sentenced ADP is primarily due to lack of jail capacity.

## Percentage Non-sentenced



The percentage of inmates who are non-sentenced is at its highest point in history (66% of the ADP). A new record for this percentage has been set every year since 2000, and every Quarter of 2003. Ten years ago, only 53% of the ADP consisted of non-sentenced inmates. Of course, jail administrators have more flexibility with regard to sentenced inmates (for example, the changing of "time served percentages"). With a budgetary ceiling on jail capacity, and limited flexibility regarding the incarceration of non-sentenced individuals, the percentage of non-sentenced inmates will continue to rise.

## Average Number of Persons Booked Per Month



Given what's been said above about jail-capacity limits, it is ominous that the number of bookings per month is higher than it's been in quite some time. In the 3rd Quarter of 2003, 106,678 individuals per month were booked into Type II, III or IV facilities. The average number of bookings per month was 105,593 in 1993. Since then, the number has been lower than that (dropping to 96,695 in 2001), until the current Quarter. This Quarter's number of bookings per month is over 6,600 per month higher than one year ago. Considering the fact that currently over 15,000 individuals are given pretrial releases or are released early from their sentences due solely to lack of jail space, we appear to be heading toward a jail-carcacity crisis.

### Average Length Of Stay



The current Average Length of Stay (ALS) statistic was initiated in 2002 on a trial basis. It was intended to be an improvement over the former computational procedure that was an estimate based upon bookings and average inmate population. The new statistic was intended to be an actual average number of days in custody of individuals released during the Quarter. As the reader can see, the reported ALS has bounced around quite a bit in the two-year trial period. We are investigating to determine whether this lack of consistency is accurate or not. In future reports, we will provide the results of our research.

 lists the jurisdictions that experienced a total increase of 2,796 ADP, and the jurisdictions experiencing decreases had a total increase of 3,057 ADP. Subtracting 2,796 from 3,057 produces the overall decrease of 261 between the third quarter of 2002 and the third quarter of 2003.

1. The two numbers at the bottom indicate the "total increase" in ADP (in this case 2,796) and "total decrease" in ADP (-3,057). In other words, the jurisdictions Some important conclusions from this table are:
2. The Fresno ADP increase of 803 is 36.2% of the total increase of 2,796. Forty-one percent of the total increases of 3,057 inmates.
3. Jurisdictions that experienced a decrease in ADP are listed from smallest decrease to largest decrease (Amador Sherriff's Department to Los Angeles Sherriff's to large decreases to San Bernardino Sherriff's Department) to Los Angeles Sherriff's to large increases (Napa Corrections Department, you have accounted for 100% of the you get to Napa Corrections Department, you have accounted for 100% of the four jurisdictions had increases (down to Napa Corrections Department). When you get to Napa Corrections Department, you have accounted for 100% of the increases to 2,796.
4. The cumulative percentage of ADP increase for the top four jurisdictions (Fresno Sherriff's Department to San Francisco Sherriff's Department) is 54.94%. In other words, four jurisdictions accounted for about 55% of the total ADP increase. Three jurisdictions (Contra Costa, San Francisco and Los Angeles Sherriff's for approximately 5% of the total decrease.
