The CBYCC was opened in 2006 and is a well-constructed, full function, modern design detention facility. The 21,050 sf facility sits on a County-owned site with sufficient open area to main circulation of the CBYCC with a covered connector. In total, the project will consist of 160 laundry, staff, and administration area; the 2-twenty bed housing units will be used for special

Specifically, the new housing unit will consist of:
