 - ◆ \$78 Million Requested
- ◆ **70 moved forward for rating**
 - ◆ \$72 Million Requested
 - ◆ 13 Cities
 - ◆ 49 CBOs
 - ◆ 8 Small Cities
- ◆ **33 proposals funded**
 - ◆ 13 Cities (including Los Angeles)
 - ◆ 14 Community-Based Organizations
 - ◆ 6 Small Cities
