Section 1: Project Need

1.1

The target population for San Benito County's Youth Program Facilities Grant Program is 707(b) WIC offending youth that are referred to the San Benito County Probation Department. A review of data trends from FY 2015-2020 identified the following characteristics for this population of youth: youth ages range from 13 to 17 years; ninety-five percent of the youth identified as male; five percent identified as female; and eighty-one percent of the youth served were Hispanic/Latino. Based on our data analysis, these youth scored an average of 4.98 on the Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) assessment which indicates a higher likelihood of heart disease, lung cancer, diabetes and many autoimmune diseases, as well as depression, violence, being a victim of violence, and suicide. Further, our assessment data shows our 707(b) youth also experience the highest need for mental health treatment and reported higher rates of suicidal ideation. These data trends highlighted and emphasized the need for trauma informed and culturally relevant services.

1.2

The targeted population to be served will be all youth referred to the probation department for having allegedly committed a 707(b) WIC offense in the community. The projected number of youths this program would serve would range from 10 to 25 per year. The length of time a youth would be committed to the program will vary based on the individual needs of the youth.

Section 2: Project Description

2.1

The San Benito County Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC) Subcommittee proposed to develop a wraparound approach to deliver services to meet the needs of the realigned youth. The Partners Achieving Change Together (PACT) Team will provide wraparound services to 707(b) WIC offending youth who score moderate to high on the Positive Achievement Change Tool (PACT) assessment. This program will

target youth at risk of being moved to the adult court system. The PACT Team's objectives are to enhance youth's educational skills, teach vocational skills, build positive social community ties, help support healthy life choices, secure safe and stable housing, divert youth from incarceration, enhance community supervision, and address the complex needs of youth and their families (including mental health and substance abuse). This program encompasses administering appropriate assessments, individualizing treatment plans for youth, and ensuring services are youth and family driven. The PACT Team wraparound service program will focus on treating the individual needs of the youth, improving their mental health and well-being, furthering their education, assisting to gain employment, improving familial relationships and communication, and overall reduce recidivism.

2.2

Currently, the San Benito County Probation Department works collaboratively with our community partners in serving our high-risk youth. However, we recognize the growing need to enhance available services by creating the PACT Team wraparound services, to meet the needs of the realigned youth and their families. Services will begin with the youth's entry into the juvenile justice system and continue through reentry and the completion of probation. This multi-agency approach will facilitate better coordination of services among existing agencies.
